

Open Church

Just as we had become accustomed to having "Open Church" again on the 2nd Saturday of the month after the many months of lockdowns, we now find that this will not be possible for a while (Christmas Mini-Market in November). So the next time the Church will be open on the 2nd Saturday of the month between 2.00pm and 4.00pm will be on 10th December. Do come along for a cup of tea and a chat and have a look round.



Our island history is full of stories about our Leaders and the ways that they come to power and the ways that they give it up. These are many and varied. One particular event that shows what can happen when things do not turn out as expected is recalled at this time each year. It goes back to 1605 when Guy Fawkes (who was in charge of looking after the gunpowder) and his fellow conspirators put in place a scheme to blow up the House of Lords and assassinate King James I. The scheme was thwarted and 5th November became the date to mark the event which features bonfires and fireworks. As I grew up the evening of 5th November was an occasion for families and neighbours to get together. We would enjoy watching the fireworks and standing around the bonfire as it burst into flames. We would roast chestnuts and marshmallows. Over the years traditions have changed quite a lot as we have become more aware of the impact of our actions on our world and the people living around us. Thankfully we have also come to realise that there are better ways to deal with those who disagree with us!

I cannot recall the last time I was at a bonfire party. However, bonfires, fireworks and religion have often gone hand in hand for a very long time. China is a country where their religious traditions featuring fireworks go back for over 2000 years. Some communities in the Mediterranean link Saints Days with fireworks following Masses held for local saints. Our November 5th tradition probably grew out of the celebration of New Year which used to take place on the 1st November which people marked with bonfires all over the land.

The month of November also provides us with an opportunity to remember those who have died in the wars that have ravaged our world. In particular we think of previous generations who have lost their lives in the first and second world wars, but we know all too well that there have been many wars since then and we know that wars continue today. Year by year people gather together as families and communities to pay their respects and give thanks for the sacrifice made by so many in order that we may live peaceable lives. We owe them a great deal. It is worth bearing in mind just how blessed we are to live in a country that is at peace. Over the past few weeks many people have been caught up with what has been happening in the world of politics. I do not intend to delve into the rights and wrongs of what has happened, but by the time you read these lines we will have a new Prime Minister. We have perhaps seen in a unique way just how complicated it can be to look after a country as complex as ours. Maybe as we think about the peace that we enjoy we might also think of those in Parliament who seek to maintain this peace; that they will listen to each other and to the wider community to ensure that we can continue to enjoy peace and share it with all.

The Apostle Paul put it like this, "I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity."

3 Oct 12kg; 10 Oct 26.5 kg; 17 Oct 14 kg; 24 Oct 13 kg; representing an average of approximately 16.5 kg per week.

Our Church Schools

Excellence in Education, Kindness in Community, Courage through Faith

The Governing Bodies of both our schools are continuing to consult on a proposal to federate. More details are given below and we are grateful to those who have already responded to the consultation using one of the website addresses. There are still a few days before the consultation closes.

"St Jude's Junior School has long been a cornerstone of our parish and last year it was joined by St Jude's Infant School, a new church infant school created from the closure of Englefield Green Infant School and Nurseries and Christ Church Infant School. From the outset, the two schools have had a shared Christian vision and set of values and have worked closely together. The Governing Bodies of each school are currently consulting on a proposal to federate, which means that a single Governing Body will be responsible for both schools from next February; a natural extension of the schools' evolution to date. The consultation will close on the 11th November".

St Jude's Junior School came into church at Harvest time and offered a wonderful celebration with singing, readings, prayers and visual aids. 
Sunday 13th November
