A Starry Night

One of the Christmas Carols I especially enjoy is "A Starry Night" which I'm told made the school assembly pop charts in 1967! I was saddened to hear recently of the death of that carol's composer — Major Joy Webb of the Salvation Army. I asked Kathy Kerslake, a member of the congregation at St Jude's, whose faith was formed within the ministry, life, and music of the Salvation Army, to tell us something about Joy Webb. This is what she wrote:

I had the privilege of knowing and working with Joy Webb since the mid-sixties. A chance remark by the then General Coutts of the Salvation Army, had changed the direction of her life, challenging her to bring the message of the Christian Gospel into places where people were, but which perhaps had not been reached before. In 1964 Joy had founded a music group, aptly named "The Joy Strings". So, with guitars to the fore, the group began to find ways to bring the Gospel to many people who probably would not have thought about going into a church. What a God blessed venture it proved to be!

Joy remembered responding to a request from a local vicar to sing at a service in honour of the late Elvis Presley. Approaching the church, she was met by Elvis' "fans" all dressed as Elvis! She recalled how the vicar spoke of a loving God to whom Elvis had gone to be received as his child. Joy sang "It is no secret what God can do..." and the fans responded-"thank you for being here...". The service then had to be repeated for the hundreds of fans waiting patiently in the church yard!

Joy loved Christmas! She wrote and directed a special carol celebration each year for her "little people", children from "The Haven", a home for children in the care of the Salvation Army. She once reflected what an enormous surprise it must have been for those who witnessed the events of the first Christmas night. And so, the song "The Surprise" was born. "Let the Surprise fill your heart again, making the old story new...."

I recall playing for a performance called "The star that lost its way" at Wembley, another of Joy's creations. This was in the presence of the Princess Royal and had to be perfect! Unfortunately, when the cherubs were due to appear to sing "The Star Song" they were nowhere to be seen! They had indeed lost their way! Joy as always, covered the blip magnificently and order was restored very quickly! BUT the Princess Royal DID notice and mentioned it (with a twinkle in her eye) when Joy was presented to her afterwards!

There is so much I could share about Joy. Her shining Christian example, always having time for people, her ministry, shared spiritual experiences, sadness, joy, laughter, the real presence of God when listening to her words. She often said that when writing words and melody, she would place the work in her lap and pray that God would in-breathe it with his Spirit. Many will testify that Joy's unique approach to ministry helped them to find the faith for which they longed.

"And their hearts believed again, for the peace of men; for a Boy was born, King of all the world." '

I am very grateful to Kathy for sharing those lovely reminiscences. This Christmas we shall be singing once again the many carols that have become so precious and familiar to us. Behind every one of those carols is a writer who, like Joy Webb, longed to share the glorious truth of the first Christmas in fresh and vivid ways. We thank God for them all.

As our hearts lift once again with the beauty of Christmas music, let's pray that the words too will touch our lives afresh. Let's pray that in the dark streets of so many parts of the world today the everlasting light of God's love in the Lord Jesus Christ will shine.
