Artificial Intelligence

Artificial Intelligence is a topic that is very much in the news at the moment. I expect that most of us have dealt with AI on the internet; perhaps during a conversation with a company about an order we have placed or about a problem to do with a piece of technology. Sometimes the machine can help, but sometimes it has to hand us on to a human in order to sort things out. I understand why people are concerned about what may happen with AI as these machines become better at what they are doing. We find ourselves wondering whether they will become cleverer than we are. We know that there are lots of difficult questions, but perhaps the ability of a machine to carry out routine tasks, which may be tedious rather than difficult is something we might well be happy for them to do. The debate continues. The Christian faith contains a concept relating to the Holy Trinity which, for me, falls into the category of a `'difficult" topic. The subject itself is considered to be so important that we even have one Sunday each year dedicated to it. This year the service is due to take place on 4th June; Trinity Sunday.

In my role as the superintendent of the Staines and Feltham Circuit of the Methodist Church one of my tasks is to prepare "The Plan" which sets out details of who is preaching in the Churches I cover. The area is quite big and ranges from Feltham right out to here at Englefield Green. It can be quite difficult to find preachers who are comfortable leading a service on Trinity Sunday. The reason seems to be related to the "problem" of explaining what is meant by "Trinity". This is a word which you will not actually find in the Bible. Although St Paul comes close at the end of the second letter that he wrote to the Christians living in Corinth which he ended by writing, "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you." (NRSV). Here in this blessing St Paul refers to God, Jesus and Holy Spirit and yet Christians believe in just one God. Over the years theologians and individuals have attempted to explain how three can become one and how one can be three. I am sure that you will be aware of explanations that include people having different roles, about three leaved plants, about water as a liquid, as a gas and as a solid. The list goes on. Sadly each time someone comes up with a suggestion someone else comes along and explains why it does not work. One theologian wrote, that the doctrine of the Trinity confronts us with perhaps the most difficult thought that the human mind has ever been asked to handle. He goes on to write, that even though it is not easy, it is true. I wonder what AI would make of it? In the meantime, we will be looking at the subject in Church on 4th June at 9:30am. Maybe you might like to come along and explore the topic with us.

At our Annual Parochial Church meeting in May we received a report from Mrs Vicki Chiverton, Head Teacher at our St Jude's Junior School, about the work of both the Junior and Infant Schools, now of course known as the "St Jude's Church of England Schools. Here is a quote from her excellent report:

The most significant event for the infant and junior schools this year is their federation. After a year of consultations and joint working, we now have one governing body across the two schools. This is representative of the effective collaboration that has taken place over the last few years, started initially by Jan Pells, when she was the Head Teacher of the infant school and continued by Michelle McNamee. It was a pleasure to work with them both. Michelle has now resigned from her post and will be moving down to Sussex to live nearer to her family, which means that the leadership structure of the infant and junior schools over the coming year has yet to be resolved. These are changing and challenging times for education.

We thank God for Mrs Chiverton and all the Senior Leadership Team, Teachers and Teaching Assistants and all the Schools Staff. It is indeed a challenging time in education as indeed in many parts of the Public Sector. Please continue to pray for the work of both schools and indeed for all the educational establishments in our Parish.
